Safa Community School

We love when our members take on different challenges and do it with passion that can inspire us all.

The team at Safa Community School proves that you can help animals, the environment and the community while learning and having fun.

Here is what they have been up to:

- Researching the garbage patches in the oceans and conducting lunch box surveys monitoring the amount of waste plastic each class is producing. As part of their learning, teachers filled the swimming pool with lots of single use plastic items. Students then swam in it to imagine what it is like for sea creatures whose homes are polluted!
- Learning about food waste in the UAE and how they can make sustainable choices to help the planet.
- Reducing paper usage at school. The secondary Eco Team also organised a desert clean up trip in collaboration with Simply Bottles. With the help of other students and local law enforcers, the students removed over 18 large, biodegradable bags of plastic and rubbish.
- SCS often takes part in fundraisers and community outreach programs like raising money for Breast Cancer Awareness;
 Festive Box appeal and Ramadan box appeal; 'Two For Tuesday', where students bring in an extra snack or piece of fruit which is then donated locally to those less fortunate.

Private International English School **Trash to treasure**

We love a sustainable fashion show! Thank you Private International English School for taking part in this green fashion show.

An inter school fancy dress competition was conducted by Shining Star International School in December 2019, with the theme

ENDANGERED ANIMALS for KG 1, FAIRY TALES for KG 2, PRODUCTS WE USE FOR GRADE 1 AND 3R's for grade 2.

Students of Bhavan's Kindergarten and grade 1 and 2 participated with great enthusiasm; they dressed up with recycled materials and spoke about the theme they portrayed. K G and Grade 1 tiny tots grabbed the 1st prize, while grade 2 bagged 3rd prize. The little ones spread the message of sustainability through their pretty green walk.

A famous quote says: "When you put the whole world picture together, recycling is the right thing to do."

The objective of the activity was to make children appreciate, learn and progressively understand that the resources should be used carefully, and reuse waste material and not always depend on new things. They learned the valuable lessons of Reuse, Reduce and Recycle and to maintain an ecological balance to making maximum use of eco-friendly materials.







Exciting new resources for protecting our oceans

Check out our new resources about the oceans of the world, developed in partnership with DP World.



The oceans and seas of the world are truly amazing and beautiful places full of stunning sea life.

Sadly, they are becoming more and more polluted with filling unwanted plastics and other waste. More importantly, overfishing is threatening all marine life.

But there are things we can do to help preserve our oceans and seas.

Therefore, we've created a series of exciting resources to help you understand the importance of oceans and seas and suggestions on how you can help protect them:

Our oceans, our pollution – Use this resource to discover the types of waste floating around the ocean and how you can help, no matter where you live!

Warm seas, cold seas, ocean currents

 you will learn more about the diversity and location of marine life, and carry some simple experiments that show the conditions plant life needs to thrive and how this relates to water temperature

Ocean life – learn more about the plants and animals that live in the ocean

Commercial fishing – This resource examines the fishing industry and suggests choices that consumers can take to help steer it into more sustainable practices

Aquaculture – Compare and contrast the environmental impact of salmonid (salmon and trout) farming to the farming of bivalve molluscs such as oysters and mussels. Look at ways you can consume more ethically. Brainstorm ways that you can make a difference.

Where is Jane

During September Dr Jane visited the USA with a wide variety of events in Boston, Atlanta, Jackson Hole, Los Angeles and San Francisco.

These included meetings, Roots & Shoots gatherings, lectures and then filming for the IMAX film with the Blackfeet Native American community and Bison who play such a key role in many parts of the USA. The National Geographic 'Becoming Jane' exhibition has now moved to St. Louis and Dr Jane was able to be there for events linked to that. She made her first visit to the Jane Goodall Institute's new offices in Washington DC and met many members of staff there for the first time.

Whilst in Los Angeles Dr Jane tested positive for covid and fortunately had the doctors and medication close to hand during the week there so could do her events virtually.

Dr Jane then travelled to Vienna Austria to meet with Executive Directors from JGIs around the world including JGI UK's CEO Corinna McShane for four busy days of meetings, sharing, planning and learning from each other on the many and varied programmes our colleagues have in place. Our Roots & Shoots Global Coordinators Rita and Andres shared updates on global programmes to benefit people, animals and the environment and we were fortunate to learn of the work of many of our JGI countries represented at the meeting ranging from China, Malaysia and Taiwan to Tanzania, Uganda, South Africa Chile, Argentina, USA and of course the UK!

Dr Jane then attended a wonderful gathering of 700 active Roots & Shoots members of all ages in Baden, Austria where students presented their projects including concern for plastics, the use of 'graffiti moss' and how to extend the life of fashion items. Dr Jane also met with the President of Austria. JGI Austria hosted a lovely evening fundraiser for which everything was donated by generous local companies including the wonderful vegan cookery from Tian restaurant in Vienna. Amongst the items auctioned were charming Jane Goodall dolls created by JGI UK Claire Quarendon and an incredible portrait of the Gombe chimpanzee Fifi created in stitches donated by the artist.

We are already planning for 2023 which will include visits to Tanzania, UAE, some European countries, the USA (including the premiere of the new IMAX film in Pheonix Az and in Sudbury, Canada) in May and the launch of the SSE tv series on Apple TV during April. 
Dedicate a project for Dr Jane's 89th Birthday
